Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer was present to discuss the following issues:

1. Mr. Brausch received a call from Betty Stegemoller regarding the State Route 122 & Utica Road waterline extension. Mrs. Stegemoller owns the house just beyond the extension. Mrs. Stegemoller's daughter owns the last house on the line and therefore would like to install a meter pit on her daughter's property and run service from there to her house at her cost. Mr. Brausch stated that he had explained that she would need to obtain private easements from her daughter in case there would be any change of ownership in the future.

Upon discussion the Board agreed to allow Mrs. Stegemoller to connect to the water line at her expense.

2. Mr. Brausch stated that he has two change order requests from Welsh Excavating Co. for the Thornton Grove Sanitary Sewer Extension Project. He explained that, due to an oversight, the removal of the Thornton Grove Pump Station was not included in the contract. The additional costs would be approximately \$7,000 and that the pumps and some parts will be re-purposed.

Commissioner Kilburn stated that he would like to get a price quote for the Pump Station Removal from Freeze Construction, who has done similar work for the County in the past.

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The second change order would be for an additional \$97,000 due to a need to realign where the pipes would need to go. There is an existing gas line, which was not marked by Duke Energy, where the pipes were scheduled to be placed. Commissioners South and Kilburn stated that they would like to see some maps and additional information prior to approving the change order.

Mr. Brausch stated that he would bring the requeste	d information the next scheduled meeting.
