DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present along with Dave Walling, Deputy Sanitary Engineer, for a work session to discuss the inquiry of capacity of available sanitary sewers from a developer for an area of Deerfield Township.

Mr. Walling explained that there are three sections of land along I-71 in Deerfield and Union Townships that are in the sewer improvement area but are not developed. He then stated that it would be beneficial to have a complete sanitary sewer study completed that would include not only the property the developer is inquiring about but along the other two areas located in Union Township. He stated that the developer is willing to pay his share of the study which is estimated to cost approximately \$20,000.

There was discussion relative to the property being the last remaining prime development land along this section of I-71 and the possibility of job creation with its development.

Upon further discussion, the Board requested Mr. Walling to contact the owners of the remaining property and inquire if they are willing to financially participate in the study as well.

Jim Aumann, Treasurer, was present for a meeting of the Investment Advisory Board.

Mr. Aumann presented the following information as of September 30, 2013:

Mr. Aumann explained that he had anticipated \$1,000,000 in investment income to the general fund last year. He explained that the amount will be more like \$900,000, however, the increase in collections fee was over \$100,000 so that the overall amount to general fund will be a little more than anticipated.

Mr. Aumann stated that delinquency tax collection is down 25% which is a good indication of Warren County's economy.

Mr. Aumann discussed the possibility of contracting with a financial advisory for Warren County. He presented the resume of Roger Cox for consideration by the Board at a later date and stated that the changes are based upon a % of assets. He then stated that the cost of the service would more than pay for itself.

Upon discussion, the Mr. Aumann stated he will have further discussion on this request in 2014.
