DISCUSSIONS

Pleas Court Community Corrections Grant #289-1220. Vote: Unanimous

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present for a work session to discuss the following matters:

1. Deerfield Springs PUD—Mr. Brausch stated he received a letter from the developer requesting the availability of sanitary sewer for his parcel along US RT 22-3 in Deerfield Township.

Mr. Brausch stated that the development was approved at a lower density than the developer had requested.

Bruce McGary, Assistant Prosecutor, reviewed the background on this parcel and where we are today and stated that there is no question that this sanitary sewer is a public sewer due to the fact that Warren County was the applicant to the Ohio EPA when the system was initially installed.

Mr. Brausch stated that his department has received all of the requested information in order to review the availability of sewers.

David Walling, Assistant Sanitary Sewer Director, stated he has reviewed the system and he feels confident that surcharging within the system is not likely to happen and it is his opinion that sufficient capacity is available to handle the flow from the proposed development without overflow.

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Commissioner Grossmann questioned why these matters are brought to the Board of Commissioners and not handled directly by the department head when these are technical matters.

There was discussion relative to the capacity concerns of the wastewater treatment plant and the policy that was established at that time for the Board to be informed of all matters relative to the commitment of sanitary sewer service relative to the treatment plant. It was determined that the desire of the majority of the Board desires to continue with the current policy of discussion with the Commissioners prior to a commitment letter being provided.

Commissioner Grossmann stated that he represented a company owned by the developer in 2008 but no longer has ties and questioned if he should refrain from voting on this matter.

Mr. McGary stated that no action is required by the Board of Commissioners and therefore, it is not a concern.

Commissioner Grossmann stated he feels confident to allow Mr. Brausch to issue the availability letter based upon engineering standards.

Commissioner Young stated his desire to follow the law but wants to make clear he does not approve of high density apartments along US RT 22-3. He stated his opinion that the area is over developed.

Commissioner South stated her desire for Mr. Brausch to proceed with the issuance of the availability letter.

2. Village of Waynesville—Mr. Brausch presented background information relative to the Warren County sanitary sewer service area to which the Village of Waynesville provides treatment. He then reviewed the attached PowerPoint presentation.

The Board discussed the possibility of charging a surcharge to Village residents to help relieve the deficit from the County taking over ownership and operations of the Waynesville Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Upon further discussion, the Board determined to discuss this matter at a later date.

Neil Tunison, County Engineer, was present to request the Board to render a decision relative to the road name change public hearing to rename a portion of State Route 123 to Old State Route 123 in Clearcreek Township.

Mr. Tunison provided the background information relative to the public hearing that took place in February 2014. He stated that the delay in approval was due to the need for the Ohio Department of Transportation to officially dedicate the new relocated roadway in order for the Board to rename the abandoned portion. He then provided a dedication plat for approval that names the newly created connector road to Red Lion-Blackburn Way.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #15-0138) to approve the road name change of a 0.430 mile portion of SR 123 to Old SR 123 in Clearcreek Township, (Resolution #15-0139) to approve the roadway dedication plat for Old State Route 123 and Red Lion-Blackburn Way and (Resolution 15-0140) to approved Old SR 123 and Red Lion-Blackburn Way for public maintenance by Clearcreek Township.

Mr. Tunison provided an update to the Board relative to the Fields Ertel Road Connector and the Western Row Road Interchange Project.

Mr. Tunison stated that they have reached a tentative agreement with the Warren County Highway Employee Association/AFSCME and stated the following highlights of the agreement:

Pay increases: 2015 2.5%

2016 2 % 2017 2%

Changes to the work week during needed times during the summer Earning of a personal day if no unscheduled leave (at least 2 weeks prior notice) Elimination of some positions from the bargaining unit

Upon discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #15-0141) to accept the tentative agreement regarding the negotiations between the Warren County Engineer and the Warren County Highway Employee Association/AFSCME.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.





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

Treatment Options for the Massie-Wayne System

Option 1 – The Village owns & operate the WWTP and the County continues being a customer.

Harveysburg & Corwin and turn over all customer & Option 2 – The County gets out of the sewer business in infrastructure to Waynesville. Option 3 – The Village get out of the sewer business and turns over all customers & infrastructure to the County.

Option 4 – Formation of an independent Regional Sewer District.

WWTP, freeing up excess capacity to the Village's Option 5 - The County builds, owns, and operates their own future growth.

OPTION 3 – Wastewater Agreement

- Additional Customers: 1,200 Waynesville residents will be served by Warren County.
- Operating Budget: Sewer operations budget will increase by \$550,000 to \$600,000 annually.
- Anticipated Revenues from Customers: \$450,000 to \$500,000
- Indebtedness: County shall assume responsibility for all outstanding debt associated with the water and/or sewer system.
