DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Bruce McGary, Assistant Prosecutor, was present to discuss the sign policy that was adopted on March 1, 2016.

Commissioner South stated she requested this discussion due to the fact that the Warren County Board of Elections is the only early voting location and questioned the ability to amend the sign policy to allow signs during this limited period. She also stated her concern relative to the inability for directional signage to be erected when special events take place in the area such as parking /shuttle service during the Lebanon Christmas Parade and the use of the property as a staging location for the Annual Antique Tractor Parade.

Mr. McGary read the Supreme Court decision stating it is unconstitutional to allow political signs for a limited period of time.

There was discussion relative to the possibility of amending the policy to allow directional signage for county approved events.

Mr. McGary stated that the County should be utilizing release forms for each event that includes a provision that states Warren County Facilities Management will erect directional signage on their behalf.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present for a work session and discussed the following matters:

- 1. Zoar Tower Painting—The tank painting contractor had an issue with overspray on vehicles and watercraft parked in the neighboring store and lock facility. The contractor as well as their insurance company have been attempting to settle/remedy the damages and are having a difficult time dealing with the property owner.
- 2. Grinder Pumps in the Morrow-Roachester Sewer Improvement Area—Approximately 25 grinder pumps were installed during the initial construction of the sanitary sewers for this project. At the time of installation, the property owners were told that the County would provide maintenance and upkeep. The current policy exists that any grinder pump on private property is the responsibility of the property owner for maintenance and upkeep, not Warren County. Mr. Brausch requested that the County place the original property

- owners on notice that at such time as property transfers ownership from the original property owner, Warren County will no longer provide said services. Upon discussion, the Board agreed to the request and requested the Assistant Prosecutor to make a recommendation on the appropriate procedure to make said change.
- 3. Peters Cartridge Factory—A developer is proposing to construct 126 apartment units along with some type of commercial component on the prior Peters Cartridge facility. The property currently has a water main as well as a lift station that is owned and operated by Warren County. The developer desires to eliminate the public lift station and raise the site in order to provide gravity sewer to his development as well as transfer the public water main that dissects his development into a private water service. In exchange, the developer is requesting a reduced water and sanitary sewer tap in fee. Mr. Brausch estimated the cost savings to be a \$130,000 benefit to Warren County and requested the Board consider said amount in exchange. Upon discussion, the Board stated their agreement to the concept.
- 4. Mounts Park in Hamilton Township—the question of sanitary sewer availability for this property along Stubbs Mill Road in Hamilton Township has been questioned. Warren County could provide the property with sanitary sewers with the construction of a pumping station; however, the property is outside of the sanitary sewer service area. Mr. McGary stated that the Board made the sewer service area identical to the Hamilton Township Urban Service Area in 2004, with the exception of a few court ordered developments. There was discussion relative to the capacity to service the entire drainage basin. Mr. Brausch stated there was not sufficient capacity at the treatment plant to serve the entire drainage basin but the Board could choose to amend the service area and provide capacity on a first come, first serve basis.
